 ROUND-TRIP TICKETS: Stop-over privilege will be allowed at all intermediate points in either direction on All-Year Tourist, Winter Tourist, Short Limit Winter Tourist, Convention, Homeseekers, and Summer Tourist tickets, within limit, also on Round-Trip tickets sold at double the one-way fare.

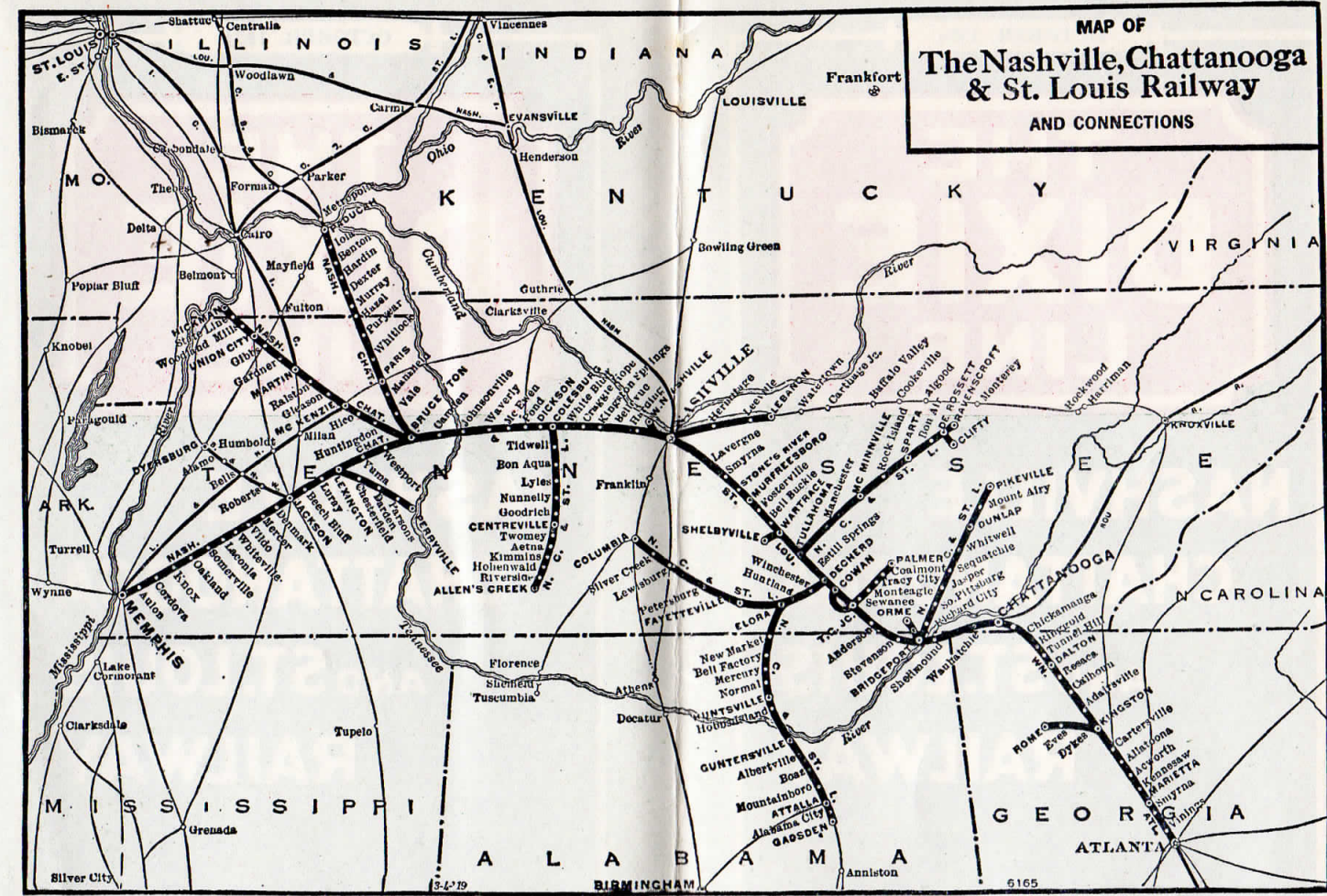
