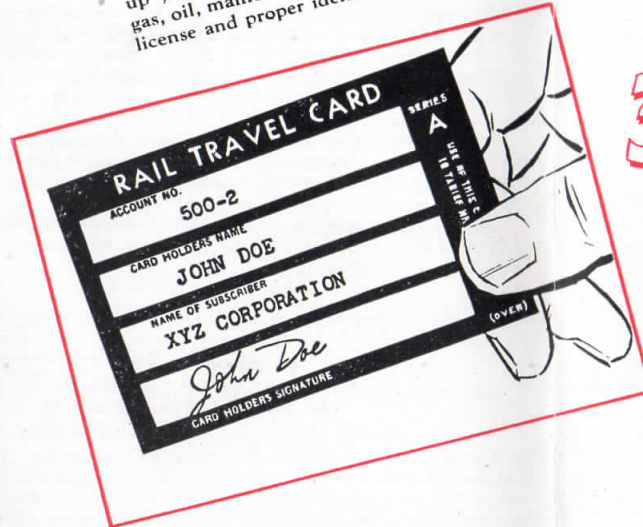

INFORMATION FOR TRAVELERS

Time between 12.01 o'clock noon and 12.00 o'clock midnight is indicated by dark face type; between 12.01 o'clock midnight and 12.00 noon by light face type.

Regarding Time Tables—This Company will not be responsible for errors in time tables, inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections; schedules and equipment shown herein are subject to change without notice.

Buy Tickets before boarding trains and avoid payment of extra charge.

Children under 5 years of age free, when accompanied by parents or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare, 12 years or over, full fare.

Adjustment of Fares.—In case of dispute with Conductors or Agents, pay fare required, take receipt and communicate with Charles Fendrych, Gen. Passenger Agent, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Redemption of Tickets.—Tickets unused or partly used will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value.

Baggage Maximums.—No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight or 72 inches in greatest dimension, or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. Free allowance subject to tariff regulations as to contents, weight, value and size.

Baggage Liability Limited.—Excess value to be declared and paid for at time of checking.

Bicycles (not Motorcycles), Baby Carriages, Dogs and Club Paraphernalia are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Dogs and small household pets (such as cats, birds, etc.), are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Small dogs, cats, or other small animals (not vicious, odoriferous or otherwise objectionable) when carried in baskets or containers, may be taken by purchasers of drawing rooms, compartments or bedrooms into the rooms they occupy.

Baggage.—This Company cannot guarantee to forward baggage on same train with passenger and, when necessary, baggage of passengers will be forwarded on other trains. To facilitate prompt receipt of their baggage at destination, passengers are advised to arrange for forwarding on a preceding train.

Lost Articles.—When articles are lost on trains or left in waiting rooms at stations, owners should apply at once to agent at station where they leave the train. These railroads will not be responsible for unchecked articles left in stations or cars.

Free Side Trip.—All one-way or round-trip tickets reading to or beyond Rochester, N. Y. via New York Central System and valid for stop-over at Buffalo, N. Y., will be accepted (without additional collection) for free side trip Buffalo, N. Y. to Niagara Falls, N. Y. and return within limit of ticket.

Air-Conditioned Trains.—Air-conditioned equipment has been assigned to regular sections of trains as shown herein. Every effort will be made to provide it as specified, but the right is reserved to employ non air-conditioned cars as necessitated by volume of traffic or emergencies.

Transferring Luggage and Passengers Between Depots in Chicago—Passengers holding tickets through Chicago may deliver their hand luggage to the Parmelee desk at the incoming depots for delivery to the parcel checking rooms of the outgoing depots at the cost of only the usual parcel checking fees.

The Parmelee transfer coupon—included as part of your through ticket—also entitles you to the choice of transfer service in Parmelee limousine from your incoming depot to your outgoing depot, or to any hotel or other destination in downtown Chicago.

Western Union—Telegrams—25-word Western Union Night Letters may be sent for as little as 27¢—nothing higher than 83¢. Extra words at slight additional cost. Day service, of course, but not in this form—at slightly higher rates. Send money safely and quickly by Western Union.

National Travelers Aid Society—Representatives of National Travelers Aid Society are located at many of the larger stations for purposes of relief of distress, and assistance of the unprotected. Those in need of such service should inquire of the station force for a National Travelers Aid Society representative.

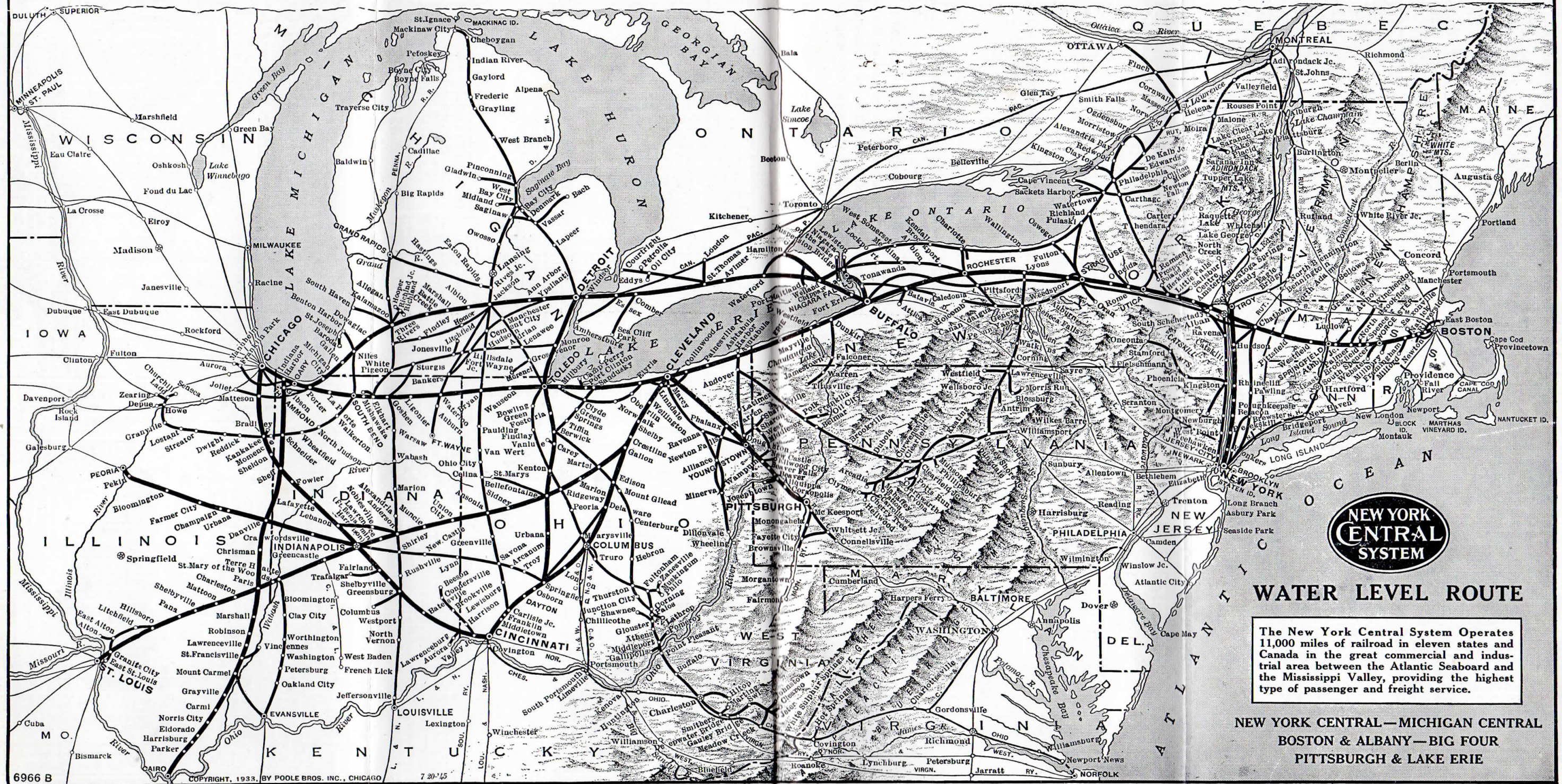
