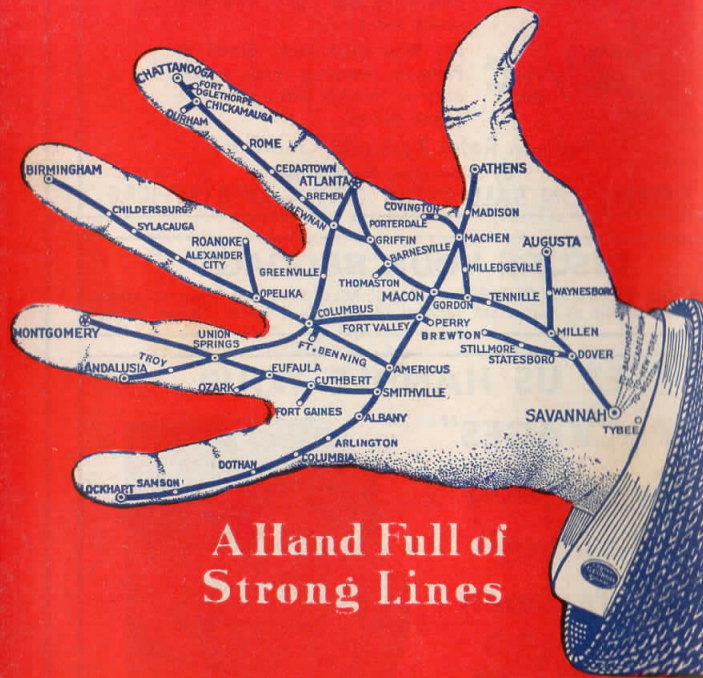

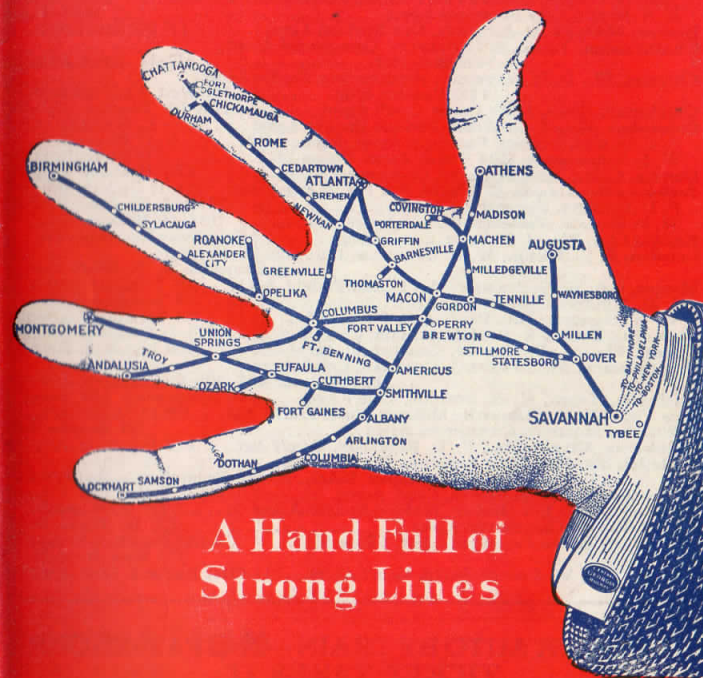

Time from 12:01 a.m. to 12:00 o'clock, noon, inclusive, is indicated by light-face type; from 12:01 p.m. to 12:00 o'clock, midnight, inclusive, by dark-face type.

Buy Tickets before boarding trains and avoid payment of extra charge. Children under five years of age free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; five years of age and under twelve, one-half fare; twelve years of age or over, full fare.

Adjustment of Fares: In cases of dispute with Conductors or Agents, pay the fare required, take a receipt, and communicate with General Passenger Agent, Savannah, Ga.

Redemption of Tickets: Tickets unused, or partly used, will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value if presented within 18 months of date of sale.

Minimum Number of Railroad Tickets Required for Exclusive Occupancy of Sections, Compartments, or Drawing Rooms (Berth or seat service) in addition to proper sleeping or parlor car ticket is as follows:

Drawing Room—Two adult railroad tickets.
Bed Room—One adult railroad ticket.
Compartment—One and one-half railroad tickets.
Section—One adult railroad ticket.

Baggage Maxima: No single piece of baggage exceeding 250 pounds in weight,

or 72 inches in greatest dimension, or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. Free allowances subject to tariff stipulations as to contents, weight, value and size.

Baggage Liability Limited: Excess value to be declared and paid for at time of checking.

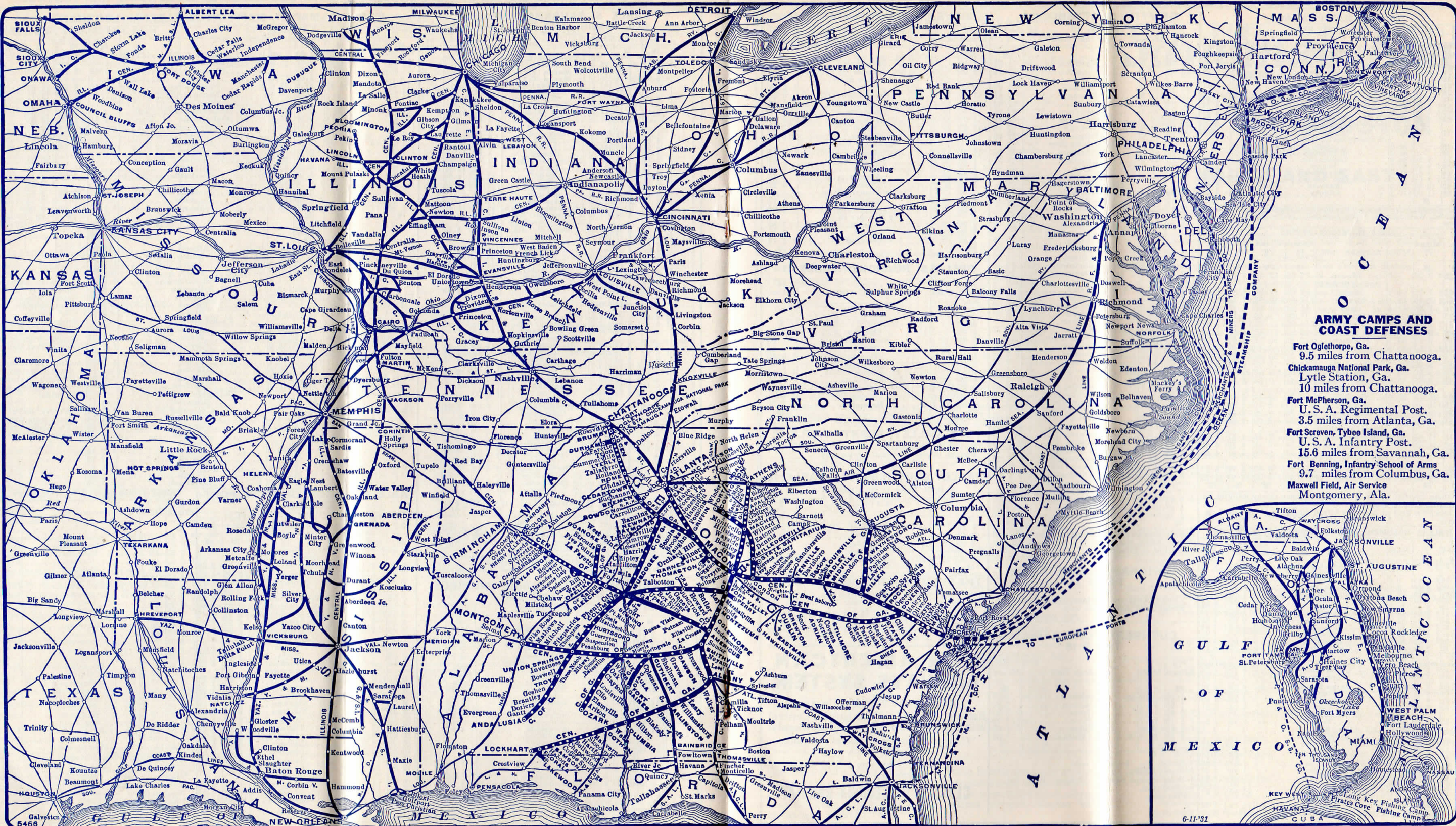
Charge for Unauthorized Articles in Baggage. When passengers fail to disclose nature of articles offered for checking and it develops en route or at destination that the transportation of such articles as baggage is not authorized, collection will be made based on single excess baggage rate for gross weight of such articles, minimum charge thirty (30) cents.

Bicycles (not Motorcycles), Baby Carriages, Dogs and Guns are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations.

Lost Articles to be inquired for at offices of Division Superintendents, Savannah, Macon and Columbus, and at office Superintendent Terminal Station, Atlanta.

No responsibility assumed for unchecked articles left in stations or cars.

Closing Ticket Windows One Minute Before Arrival of Train. At a station where it is necessary for the Agent to leave the ticket office to meet a train carrying passengers, for the purpose of forwarding and receiving baggage, or to perform other duties at the train and there is no other bonded employee at the station authorized to sell tickets the ticket window may be closed one minute before arrival of the train, and passengers who have failed to purchase tickets before that time shall be required to pay conductor's fares in accordance with passenger tariff regulations.

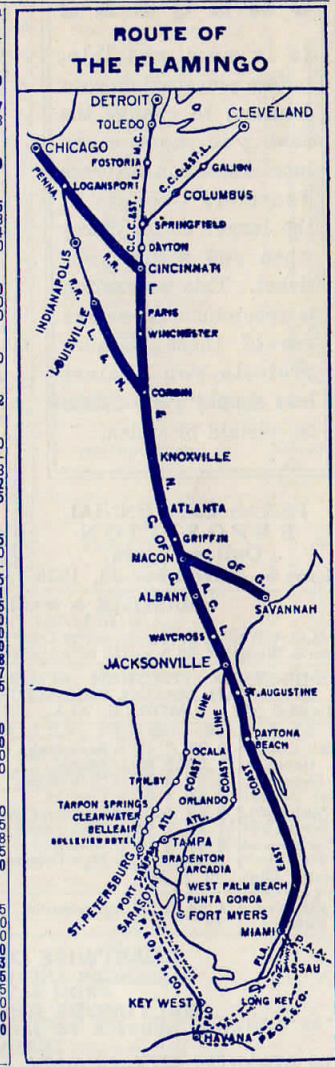

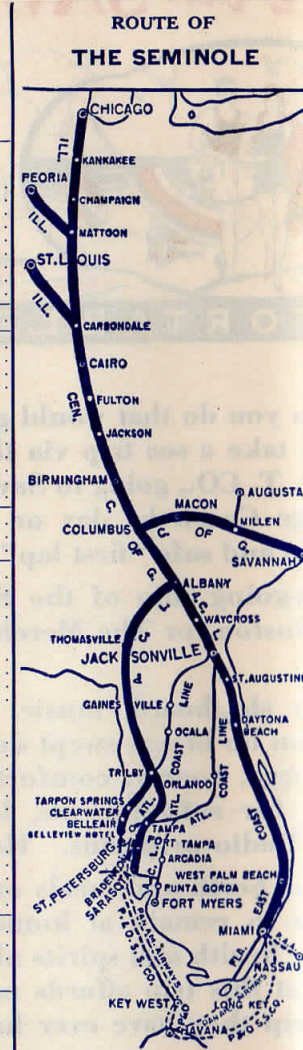

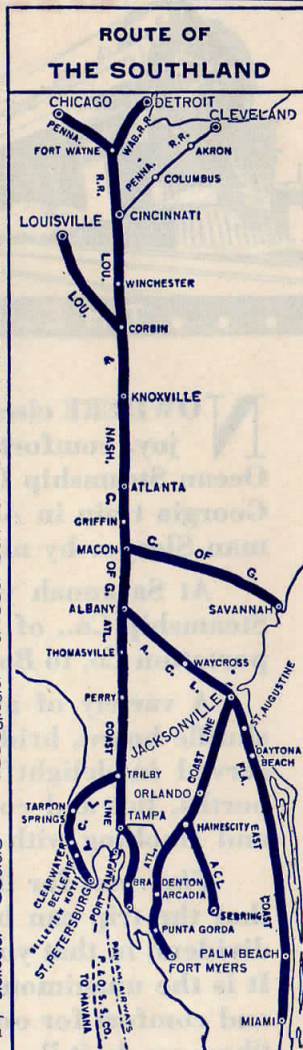
