This Company reserves the right to vary from the time shown in this folder without notice. The time of connecting transportation companies is published from information available at the time this folder was printed, and every care taken to have it correct, but this Company assumes NO RESPONSIBILITY for errors in time tables, inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains.

**Ticket Offices** are open a sufficient time before the departure of trains to permit the purchase of tickets, and passengers are requested to do so before boarding the train; however some small station offices are closed on Saturday and Sunday and tickets should be purchased in advance at such points.

**Standard Time** is used throughout this folder, **Central Time** or **Eastern Time** as shown.

**A.M. or P.M.** . . . Time from 12.01 midnight to 12.00 noon is shown in light faced figures and time from 12.01 noon to and including 12.00 midnight in heavy faced figures.

**Train Stops:** Trains make regular stops at stations where time figures only are shown. When a symbol or letter appears in train column opposite station this indicates train only stops on certain conditions. Where trains make a conditional stop, advance notice should be given to agent or train conductor.

**Redemption of Tickets:** Tickets unused, or partly used will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value. Apply to Ticket Agent or mail direct to T. J. Peterson, Auditor of Revenue, Savannah, Ga.

Children under five years of age are carried free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; five years and under twelve, one half fare; twelve years of age or over, full fare.

### BAGGAGE

**Baggage Maxima:** No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight, or 72 inches in greatest dimension or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. Free allowances subject to tariff stipulations as to contents, weights, value and size.

**Baggage Liability Limited:** Excess value to be declared and paid for at time of checking.

**Insure Your Baggage and Personal Effects**, including jewelry, furs and other valuables. Policies on sale at important ticket offices. Charge for unauthorized articles in baggage. When passengers fail to disclose nature of articles offered for checking and it develops en route or at destination that the transportation of such articles as baggages is not authorized, collection will be made based on single excess baggage rate for gross weight of such articles, minimum charge thirty cents.

**Bicycles** (not motorcycles), **Baby Carriages**, **Dogs**, and **Guns** are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Every effort will be made to facilitate the handling of baggage, but the railway cannot guarantee to forward baggage on the same train with the owner; nor can the time of arrival at destination to which checked be guaranteed. To facilitate prompt receipt of their baggage at destination passengers are advised, whenever it is possible to do so, to check it in order that same be forwarded on a preceding train.

**Lost Articles** to be inquired for at offices of Division Superintendents, Savannah, Macon and Columbus, and at office of Superintendent Terminal Station, Atlanta.

No responsibility is assumed for unchecked articles left in stations or cars.

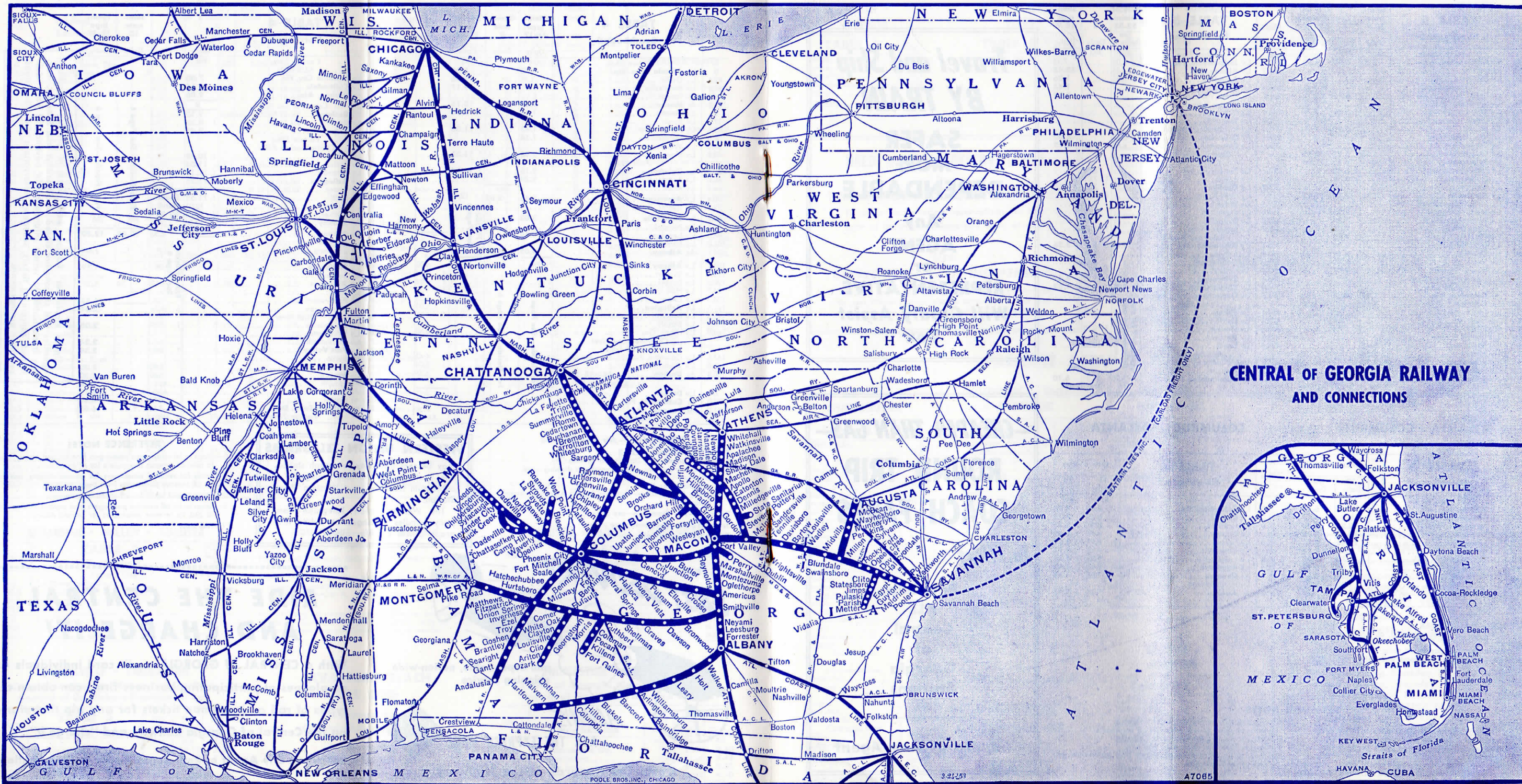

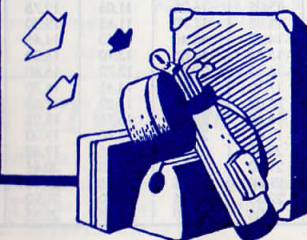
