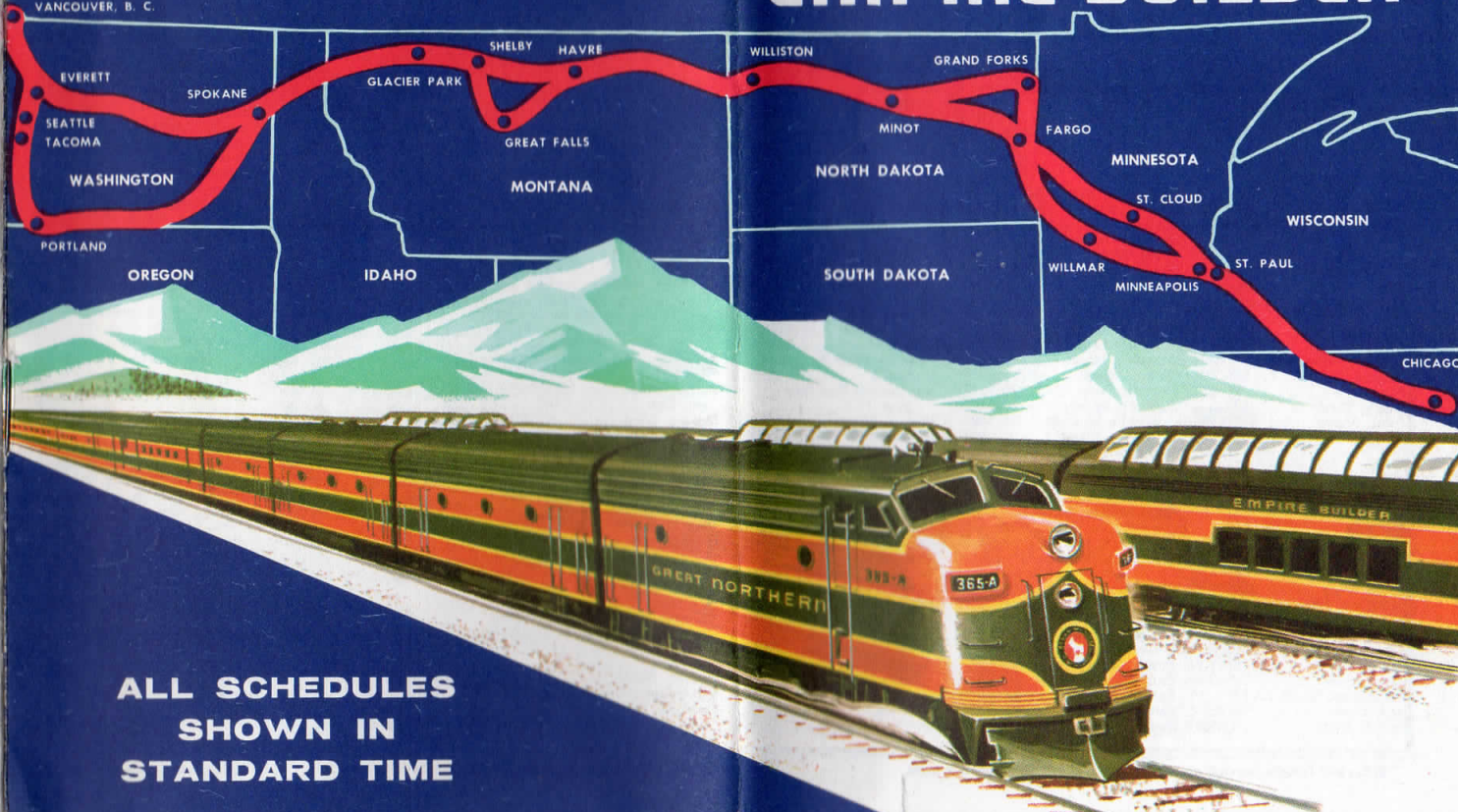

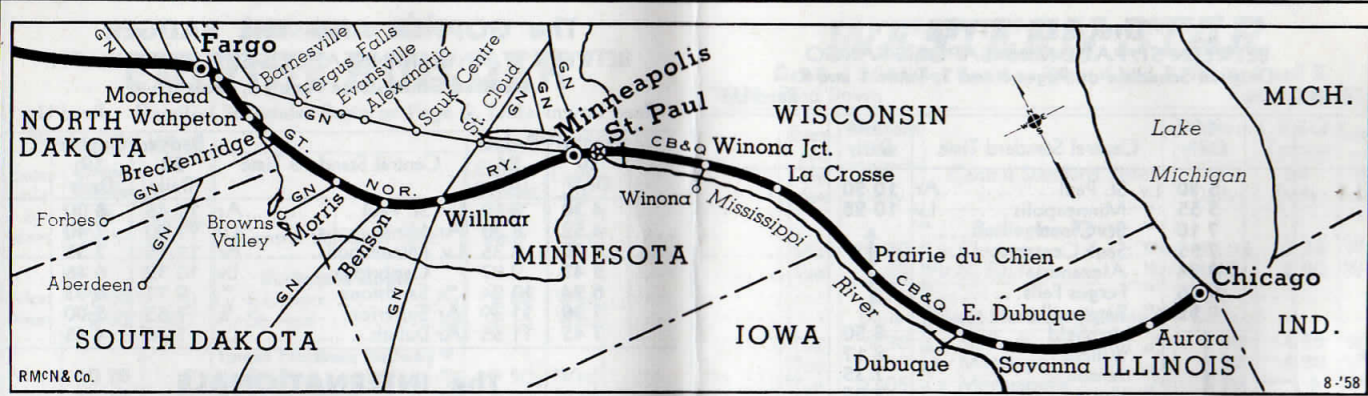


Table 1: Train schedule for Chicago, Twin Cities and Pacific Northwest via Willmar. Includes Westbound and Eastbound sections with station names and times.

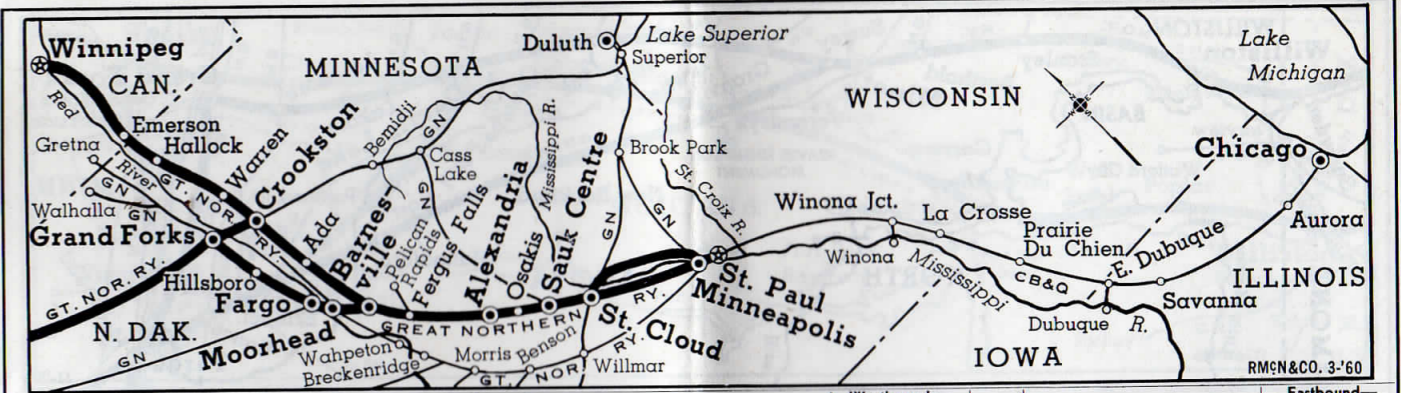

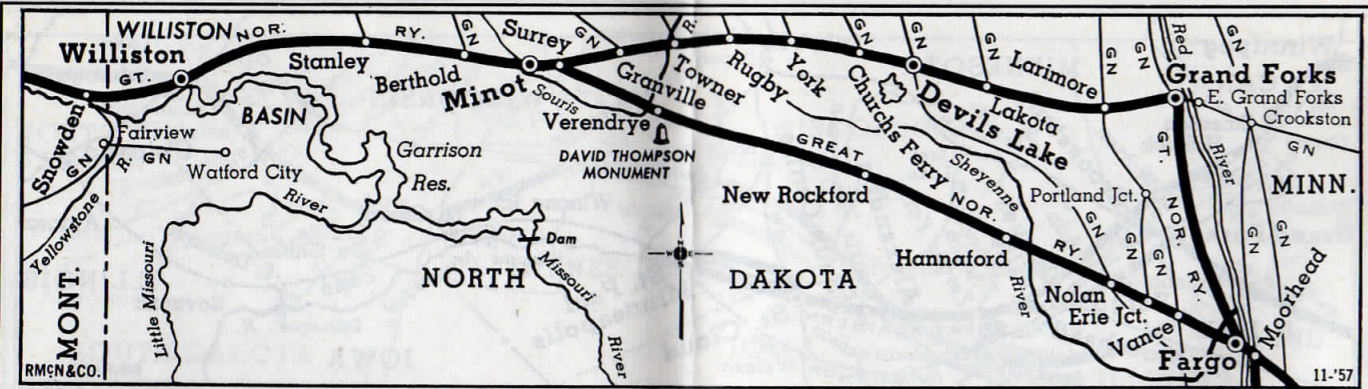

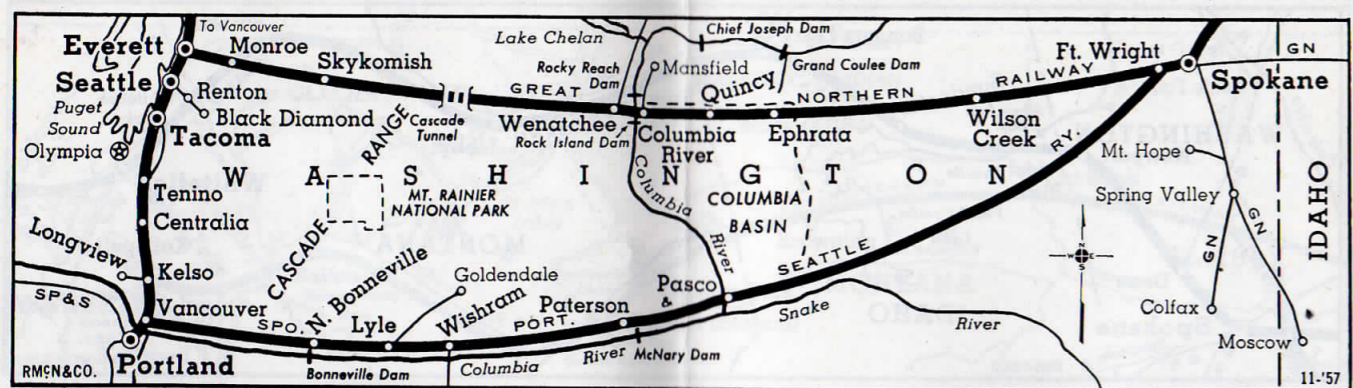

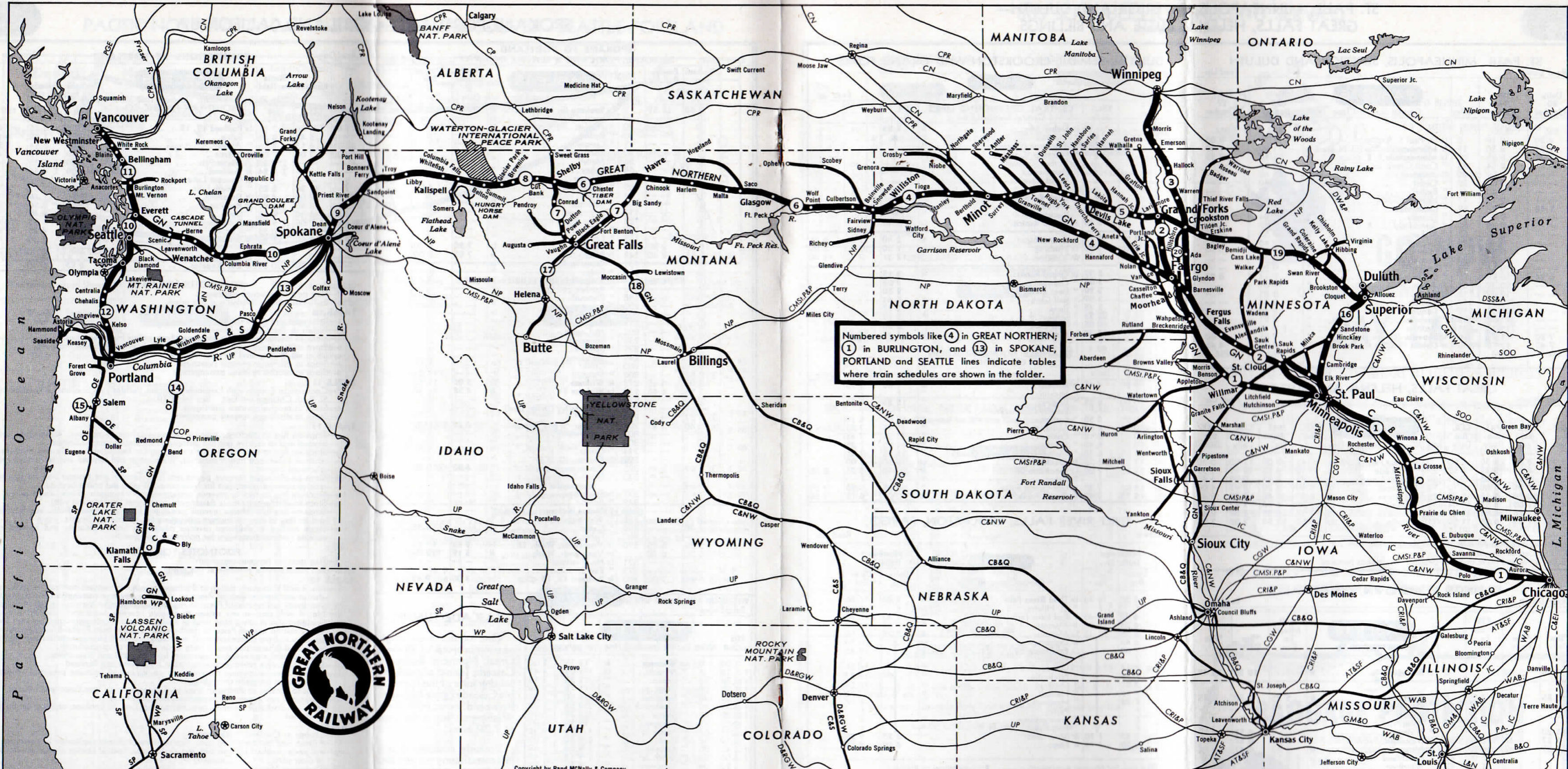

CASCADE TUNNEL. One of the great engineering projects of all time, Great Northern Railway's Cascade Tunnel pierces the solid granite of the formidable Cascade Range between Berne and Scenic in Western Washington for a distance of 7.79 miles.

Recently completed is a huge ventilating project that enables the use of diesel locomotives in the tunnel. Installation of the ventilation system marked the end of Great Northern electrified operation in the Cascades.

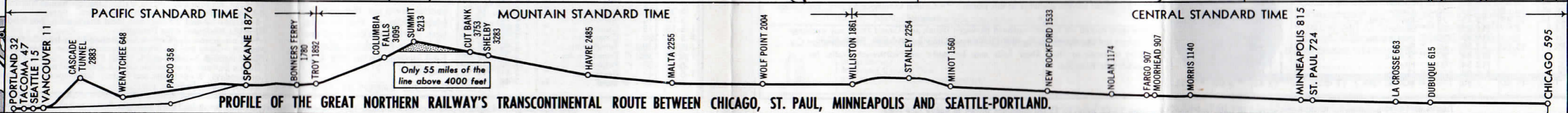

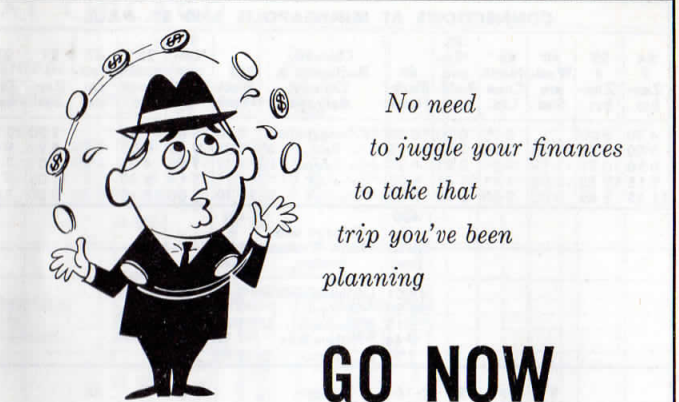

Train Schedules in this folder are subject to change without notice. The Great Northern Railway cannot be liable for missed connections caused by trains delayed by circumstances entirely beyond the railway's control.

Purchase Tickets before boarding trains. SAVE by purchasing Round Trip Tickets.

Children under five years of age, when accompanied by parent or guardian, will be carried free. Children five years of age and under twelve years of age will be charged one-half of the adult fares. Children of five and under twelve years of age will not be ticketed when traveling alone, unless advance arrangements are made through ticket agent in cases where child is deemed mature enough to travel alone. Children twelve years of age and over will be charged the adult fare.

Adjustment of Fares. Should any misunderstanding arise with conductors or agents as to the proper fare or ticket privileges, please pay fare requested, take receipt and communicate with A. E. Michel, Auditor Passenger Accounts, St. Paul 1, Minn.

Redemption of Tickets. Applications for redemption of unused portions of tickets issued by the Great Northern Railway should be addressed to Mr. A. E. Michel, Auditor Passenger Accounts, St. Paul 1, Minn. The unused portions of tickets issued by other railroads should be sent to passenger traffic manager of issuing railroad.

Invalids and Infirm Passengers. Wheelchair service is available at the following stations: Bellingham, Breckenridge, Chicago, Duluth, Everett, Fargo, Grand Forks, Great Falls, Havre, Minneapolis, Minot, New Westminster, B. C., Portland, St. Paul, Seattle, Spokane, Tacoma, Vancouver, B. C., Wenatchee, Whitefish, Williston and Winnipeg. At other points where wheel chairs are required, passengers must make their own arrangements.

Advance notice must be given for passengers requiring special handling and must be accompanied by attendant (s).

Examples of GN's Honoring, and Free Side-Trip, Arrangements:

Tickets reading from St. Paul or any other point up to Seattle, Wash. destined to Portland, Ore. will be honored via Great Northern to Seattle thence via GN-NP-UP pool train service to Portland. It is not necessary to have one coupon reading to Seattle and another coupon reading to Portland.

Tickets routed Great Northern and good for passage between Havre, Mont. and Cut Bank, Mont. will be honored westbound via Great Falls and Shelby, Mont. or eastbound via Shelby and Great Falls, Mont.

A free side trip to Great Falls, Mont. is available to holders of tickets reading in either direction between Williston, N. D. and east, and Glacier Park Station, Mont. and stations west. Side trip tickets may be secured on application and presentation of original ticket to Agent at side trip point, or coupons may be included in through ticket.

Consult agents for other honoring and free side-trip arrangements.

Consult any Great Northern Railway ticket agent or passenger representative or your local ticket agent or travel bureau for any additional information or details on your transportation requirements.

BAGGAGE INFORMATION

Hand Baggage which passenger desires to retain possession of is restricted to an amount which can conveniently be placed in the berth, seat or other accommodations purchased by the passenger. Passengers are urged for the convenience of themselves and other passengers to check all baggage except that actually needed for personal use enroute. Checked baggage is baggage handled in the baggage car as a convenience to the passenger, relieving the passenger of its care and handling.

Marking for Identification. Mark or tag each piece with Passenger's name and address and place similar information inside.

Definition of Checked Baggage. Baggage consisting of wearing apparel, toilet articles (except liquids) and personal effects necessary or appropriate for the wear, use, comfort and convenience of the passenger for the purpose of the journey and not intended for other persons nor for sale, may be checked in baggage service. Money, jewelry, negotiable papers, liquids, fragile or perishable articles, radios, typewriters, and household goods are examples of some articles not checkable as baggage, and railroads cannot accept responsibility.

Checking Allowance. Baggage weighing 150 pounds, and not exceeding \$100.00 in value, is allowed on each adult ticket; on each half-fare ticket, 75 pounds of baggage not exceeding \$50.00 in value may be checked. Family-fare-plan tickets provide for checking of 300 pounds of baggage, not exceeding \$200.00 in value, regardless of number of passengers for which the ticket is issued. Excess weight charges will be made over authorized allowance. Passenger may declare greater value at time of checking and pay charges accordingly, or may purchase at principal stations an insurance policy to cover complete value of articles checked, carried, and/or worn. (Note Service Charge described below.)

Local baggage service will be performed under Form 175 check, wherein no signed Declaration of Value is necessary and baggage will be delivered via "self-service" at principal points. This procedure carries the normal baggage allowances.

No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight, or exceeding \$2500.00 in value, will be checked.

Service Charge. At time of checking, small luggage will be checked at a charge of 25c per piece, large objects (trunks, footlockers, bicycles) at 50c each. (Contact Baggage Agent for Exceptions.)

Miscellaneous. Dogs, small household pets, bicycles, baby carriages, cribs, playpens and similar articles may be checked and transported in baggage cars within the weight and value allowance subject to tariff regulations. Consult baggage or ticket agent.

Dogs and other small household pets may be taken into room accommodations, subject to Pullman Company regulations.

Remains. Consult ticket or baggage agent.

Forwarding. Passengers are urged to check baggage in advance. Every effort will be made to facilitate the handling of baggage, but the Railway cannot guarantee to always forward baggage on the same train with the owner. Baggage should be claimed immediately upon arrival at destination to eliminate any possible assessment of storage charges.

Lost or Misplaced Articles. Contact the Manager, Mail, Baggage and Express Traffic, Great Northern Railway, St. Paul 1, Minnesota, or District Mail, Baggage and Express Agent, Great Northern Railway, Seattle 4, Washington, concerning any lost or misplaced baggage or other articles.
