Almost everybody likes a flower and a smile. San Franciscans have found the sidewalk flower stands, as suggested at left, an ideal place to get both.

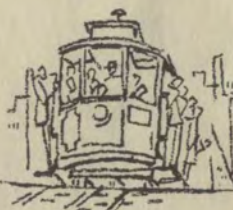


Just inside the Golden Gate, the San Francisco Yacht Harbor gleams with blue water and shining white craft of the weekend sailors.

PASSENGER LOADING ZONES: Streetcar loading zones in the downtown areas are designated by concrete safety islands. Trolley and motor coaches load at the curb. Busy loading points are designated by red curbs, and, in outlying districts, by yellow bands on streetlight poles.

LOST AND FOUND: Inquiries concerning lost property should be telephoned to the Railway's Lost and Found Department, Fillmore 6-5656, as soon as possible, with a full description of the article and the line or route you were using. About 6,000 articles and \$5,000 were returned to our patrons last year!

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

FARES AND TRANSFERS: Fare of the Municipal Railway is 15 cents. Free transfers may be obtained at time payment of fare is made and are issued to all connecting lines. Transfers are valid at point where lines or routes intersect when used to travel in one general direction without a stopover. (Having your fare ready when boarding saves time for you and your operator.)

INFORMATION SERVICE: Not quite sure how to reach a certain location using the streetcars and buses of the Railway? Our Information Center processes over 1,000 inquiries a day from satisfied

patrons! We're anxious to be of help. The number is Fillmore 6-5656, just ask for "Information."

REAR DOOR EXITING: Please use rear door when alighting. This not only speeds transit service but saves you valuable time.
